Title of report: Future Ealing Update

Developing the Borough Plan

- 1. Future Ealing is the programme of work to develop a shared vision for the borough over 2018-22 through the Borough Plan. When the plan is finalised, it will articulate the strategic direction for the LSP and set out:
 - The vision and priorities for the next four years
 - The challenges and opportunities the borough faces
 - How strategic partners will help meet these outcomes

This paper updates on the routemap for the Board's involvement until the Borough Plan is signed off in the autumn.

- 2. The LSP has already agreed:
 - To act as the strategic over-arching governance board for partnership activity in relation to Future Ealing
 - To adopt a partnership approach to delivering one public service in Ealing
 - To adopt an outcomes-based approach, and agreed the nine high level outcomes
 - The approach to scrutinising progress by agreeing an Outcomes Framework (April 2018) which:
 - Includes baselines, benchmarks, trends and outcome indicators
 - Includes outcome maps which reflect individual partner targets that contribute to each outcome
 - Includes the transformational targets to achieve the vision of the Borough Plan
- 3. Following the results of the local elections, the Labour administration reiterates its support for the nine outcomes, under the umbrella focus of 3 priorities: building more genuinely affordable homes; a living income for local people; and helping people to be healthier and neighbourhoods to thrive.



Talk Future Ealing

- 4. The council is undertaking a summer engagement exercise 'Talk Future Ealing' with residents which will focus on:
 - How residents can play their part to improve their lives and their communities
 - What residents think of the outcomes

Opportunities offered via the council and partners will be promoted at a range of events and festivals over the summer, including joining up with initiatives that partners are using to promote ways in which residents can play their part in improving their communities. Key events concluded before the LSP meeting date are:

- o 16 June <u>Hanwell Carnival</u>, Elthorne Park
- o 30 June Greenford Carnival, Ravenor Park
- o 14 July Acton Carnival, Acton Park

Upcoming events include:

- o 28 and 29 July Ealing Jazz Festival, Walpole Park
- o 19 August London Mela, Southall Park

Residents can also get involved by taking part in an online <u>Talk Future</u> <u>Ealing room</u> where they can leave their comments, with a commitment from the council to read every response. Additionally, we are encouraging everyone who lives and works in Ealing to #DoSomethingGood. We are suggesting residents take a look at <u>Ealing Bubble</u> or <u>www.do-it.org</u> for ways that they can make a difference - big or small, everything counts.

Finalising the Borough Plan

- 5. Between July and October, the content of the Borough Plan will take shape, taking into account feedback from the engagement sessions. The draft plan will be circulated to the LSP Board for comment and contributions ahead of the October meeting. The LSP will be asked to sign-off the Borough Plan at that stage, and the Council's Cabinet will also consider it when it is signing off its Corporate Plan.
- 6. We asked what LSP member organisations were already contributing to Future Ealing outcomes in terms of their existing strategic commitments, the outputs of which are the Outcome Maps. However, we are keen to identify what role LSP members can play in their new & forthcoming plans & programmes to help achieve the Future Ealing programmes and will be engaging partners between now and October.
